

Oncidium jonesianum



Native of: Brazil and Paraguay

Habitat: An epiphyte in riverine forest

Description: This plant has terete often pendulous leaves 20-40cm and tiny pseudobulbs at the base of the leaves. The flower spikes are up to 50cm long and carry up to 15 flowers each 5.5cm across.

Cultivation Guidance: At school we grow this species warm (min 15°C) and mounted although it could also be grown in a pot. We keep the plant in good light.

Flowering season: Autumn

Flask to flowering approx: 3-4yrs.

Seedling source: Commercial nursery
