

Osmoglossum pulchellum



Native of: Mexico, Guatemala and El Salvador.

Habitat: Epiphyte in mountain forest up to 2600m

Description: A small plant with thin leaves 30cm long and erect flower spikes of up to ten highly scented pretty flowers 3cm across.

Cultivation Guidance: At school we grow this cool (min.10°C) water through out the year. It doesn't seem fussy about light. Small plants quickly become specimen plants with many flower spikes.

Flowering season Spring

Flask to flowering approx. 3 yrs.
