

Mystacidium venosum



Native of: South Africa

Habitat: An epiphyte in bush and forest often forming large colonies.

Description: A small plant with 2cm diameter white flowers and up to 12 on each stem. Young plants produce a few flowers at a time while mature plants are covered in flowers.

Cultivation Guidance: At school we find that this is not a fussy plant. We grow it mounted but it would also grow in a pot. We grow it hot (min18°C) but it should cope cooler than this. In the wild it grows in low light.

Flowering season: Autumn winter

Flask to flowering approx: 1 - 2yr
