

Prosthechea radiata



Native of: Mexico and Guatemala

Habitat: Epiphytic in forests up to from 150 to 2000m altitude.

Description: This is a medium sized plant that produces spikes of up to 12 long lasting and very fragrant 4cm flowers. The flowers are non-resupinate (up side down).

Cultivation Guidance: At school we grow this species warm (min.15°C) in pots and baskets with good light.

Flowering season: Summer

Flask to flowering approx: 4yrs.
