

Cattleya aclandii



Native of: Brazil

Habitat: This species is confined to the state of Bahia growing as an epiphyte in hot rather dry areas near the coast.

Description: A dwarf bifoliate Cattleya no more than 15cm high with 10cm flowers and one or two flowers per pseudobulb.

Cultivation Guidance: At school we grow this species hot (min 18°C) and have grown it mounted and in a pot. Its natural habitat suggests it needs good light and should be kept dry when not in growth.

Flowering season: Spring

Flask to flowering approx: 4-6 yrs.
