

Aerangis kotschyana



Native of: Wide distribution in West Africa

Habitat: Epiphytic in woodland in hot wet areas or riverine trees in hot dryer areas. Has been found up to 1500m but is usually found below 700m.

Description: a small plant with leaves up to 30cm long that produces long arching inflorescences with up to 20 medium white flowers with long spurs.

Cultivation Guidance: At school we grow this plant mounted and grow it hot (min18°C) in bright light.

Flowering season: varoius

Flask to flowering approx: 3yrs
