

Angraecum florulentum



Native of: Comoro Islands

Habitat: Epiphytic on tree trunks in scrub at altitudes from 600 to 1000m in fairly bright light.

Description: Plant has branched stems up to 30cm long with 3-4 flowered inflorescences produced along the stem. The flowers are 5cm in diameter and heavily scented.

Cultivation Guidance: At school we grow this plant mounted and intermediate (min12°C). In good light.

Flowering season: May

Flask to flowering approx: 4yrs
