

Angraecum sesquipedale  
var augustifolia  
(Angraecum bosseri)



**Native of:** Madagascar

**Habitat:** An epiphyte growing in bright light at around 100m altitude in the hot lowlands of the East coast of Madagascar.

**Description:** Angraecum sesquipedale is a large growing plant with flowers up to 20cm across. This variety is smaller growing with leaves up to 20cm long and 1.5cm wide and flowers slightly smaller in groups of one or two.

**Cultivation Guidance:** At school we grow similar species in baskets or pots up on a shelf to get good light. We grow plants warm (min 15°C).

**Flowering season:** Autumn

**Flask to flowering approx.** 4yrs.
