

Paphiopedilum glanduliferum



Native of: Papua New Guinea

Habitat: Terrestrial growing in shallow humus on limestone rocks from sea level up to 200m altitude.

Description: This is a large growing Paph with leaves up to 40cm long and flower stems up to 50cm long with up to five flowers opening together. The flowers can be 16cm across and are similar to *Paphiopedilum rothchildianum* but with twisted petals.

Cultivation Guidance: At school we grow similar species hot (min.18°C) through out the year in medium light.

Flowering season: Variable

Flask to flowering approx: 6yrs.
